

The Government has recently released the final Royal Commission Report into Aged Care. In the Report, titled *Care, Dignity and Respect*, Royal Commissioners Tony Pagone QC and Lynelle Briggs AO call for fundamental reform of the aged care system.

Catholic Healthcare supports the Report's 148 recommendations and will be advocating for a strong Government response in May. But it's not just about the Government's response. Catholic Healthcare is fully committed to the challenge set by the Commissioners to create a new aged care system that supports people to live fulfilling lives as they age with dignity, respect and enjoyment. We are also driving our own initiatives in response to these recommendations.

We've had a busy start to the year with the opening and blessing of our newest Home, Holy Spirit in Casula. This event also marked the launch of our new Home and Community Services hub to provide Home Care support for seniors in that region. You can read more in this edition.

We continue to make progress on our plans for growth and expansion with the construction of our new Home in Norwest to be completed later this year and Stage 1 development of our new Retirement Living units for St Hedwig Village in Blacktown.

The time is right to encourage Government to fund a world-class, sustainable aged care system that enables senior Australians, and those who care for them, to live life to the full. The event also marks the launch of a new Home and Community Services hub based at Holy Spirit providing Home Care support to local seniors. Located in the heart of south west Sydney, the Home features private bedrooms with ensuites and a dedicated Memory Support Wing for residents living with dementia.

Holy Spirit is modern and architecturally designed, offering a range of lifestyle services and activities for residents to enjoy. "Our Enrich Model of Care is aligned with best practice and reinforces our respect for each individual. We look forward to welcoming residents to their new home," added Elaine.

"It has been a highlight of my career to be the Project Manager for Holy Spirit, Casula," said Iulia Brooks from Catholic Healthcare's Property team.

"The carefully considered design has resulted in a Home where residents can enjoy many amenities. Different door designs and colours have also been used for each resident's room, helping to individualise the spaces and assist with memory recognition.

"My favourite space is the Chapel and the beautiful stained-glass window which is hand-painted and where the light changes at different times of the day. It's such a peaceful and restful place.

"Another special feature is the display of historical photographs of the Liverpool area. These archive images were sourced from Liverpool City Council and local libraries, and include photos of the original Liverpool pool, local pubs, shopping strips, and the old Liverpool stand at Warwick Farm Racecourse," added Iulia.

General Manager, Residential Care, Andrew Kinkade said, "We are delighted to welcome our first residents to Holy Spirit, Casula and look forward to serving the local community in the years ahead."

More THAN A MENU

In Catholic Healthcare's Residential Aged Care Homes, beautiful, thoughtfully prepared meals are a highlight.

We offer nutritionally balanced meals and focus on the dining experience for residents including the atmosphere, cutlery and crockery, food presentation, temperature, texture and taste.

Sheridan Fredericks, Catholic Healthcare's Hotel and Support Services Manager says, "With a strong focus on nutrition, health and wellbeing, our accredited dieticians approve all seasonally developed menus with fresh produce. We prepare a menu guide for all our chefs, but the final menus are tailored on site at each Home with input from the residents and their families. The chefs aim to cater for the needs and tastes of our residents which has a positive impact on their mood and wellbeing.

"We also get inspiration from renowned cook, Maggie Beer and chefs including Peter Morgan Jones and Amanda Orchard who specialise in improving food experiences for senior Australians living in aged care homes. We follow the Australian Dietary Guidelines for people over seventy and take advice from the independent advisory group, Dietician Centre, Leading Nutrition."

Head chef at the newly opened Holy Spirit in Casula, Dimitar Stavreff, takes a particular interest in preparing home-style meals which are familiar, appealing and nutritious.

"Food is such an important part of our lives," says Dimitar who has over 25 years' experience as a chef. "Holy Spirit will have over 100 residents living at the Home, all with their own tastes and food preferences. My vision is to provide fresh, home-style meals inspired not only by traditional Australian favourites but also cultural dishes loved by the residents who come from a variety of backgrounds.

"I have finalised my first menu featuring meals including chicken cacciatore, New York meatloaf and veal schnitzel. We will also have Atlantic salmon fillets with hollandaise, seared lamb cutlets, plus vegetarian options and meals catered for residents with special dietary requirements. In aged care we need to keep in mind changes to palates due to medications and swallowing, with our team skilled in preparing textured modified food for residents requiring this service.

"I'm looking forward to cooking and serving meals and snacks which are such an important of a Home's daily routine. Residents will be able to select from at least two options for each meal. If a meal doesn't suit, we will find an alternative. The aim is to be flexible and seek resident feedback so everyone can have input into the menu options."

Once residents have settled in at Holy Spirit, Dimitar will arrange menu focus meetings to gather feedback, discuss what's working and brainstorm possible alternatives which still meet aged care nutritional standards. These menu focus meetings will take place regularly as new residents move into the Home.

"I'll also be working with the Home's lifestyle officer to hold special cultural food days, food to match theme days like St Patrick's Day or Melbourne Cup Day, and we have a great BBQ area ready to go."

Green thumbs AT ST PETER'S

GREEN

The residents of St Peter's Green Retirement Living Village in Lane Cove North are enjoying the fruits of their labour with a flourishing vegetable and herb garden.

Last spring, vegetable gardens and raised beds were installed guided by two green thumb residents, Bev and Sylvia. Karen Wacando, Residential Manager of St Peter's Green, went along with Bev and Sylvia to a local nursery to purchase the herbs and vegetable seedlings.

Six months on, with plenty of warm sun and rain, the gardens are blooming with produce which is shared amongst all the residents. There are tomatoes, capsicum,

celery, spinach, lettuce, zucchini, string beans and spring onions. For something sweet there's rhubarb and strawberries. And a wide selection of herbs from parsley and sage to mint and basil.

"Bev and Sylvia, along with the Gardening Committee, have done a fantastic job watering and maintaining the garden beds," says Karen. "They are more than happy for all our residents to take produce from the gardens. There's an honesty box where we ask for a donation of a few dollars in return which goes towards fertiliser and more plants."

"It's such a pleasure seeing the produce grow and thrive, and everyone able to pick fresh vegetables and herbs as they need them," says Bev. "Especially items like spinach and lettuce. It's much better value to be able to pick just a few leaves rather than buy a big bag which you never get through.

"The baby tomatoes have done really well over the summer, as have the basil, chives and mint. I am heading out to the local Bunnings today to get some more spinach, string beans and lettuce. They seem to be the favourites!

"Catholic Healthcare has also installed some new water tanks so we are looking forward to using stored rainwater to keep the garden beds looking their best."

Elsie is an 89-year old client who was receiving a home care package with Catholic Healthcare. "As a home care client, she would never entertain the idea of moving into a residential aged care home. Ever!" says Jane.

"Elsie was living in public housing in Marsfield but a couple of months ago there were plumbing issues in her unit and she had to be relocated for a week. Elsie chose to move into a serviced apartment across the road as it was close to home," she adds.

"It quickly became apparent that the apartment was unsuitable for Elsie's needs. She couldn't even go down to the kitchen to have something to eat. Elsie was miserable and asked me for help.

"I started ringing around for alternate accommodation options and suggested a residential aged care home. By this stage, Elsie was desperate, cold and hungry.

"I rang our McQuoin Park Home in Wahroonga and given her circumstances, asked if they would they take Elsie for a week. McQuoin Park agreed and offered her a respite care place.

This will help me in my role to guide our efforts as an organisation to meet our ethnical product and service sourcing obligations under the Modern Slavery Act. I also find it personally rewarding."

SUPPORT WITH LIFE'S JOURNEY

A Residential Aged Care Home is a busy place... nurses attending to resident needs, catering preparing meals, lifestyle officers running events and activities.

Amidst all of the work there are dedicated people who ensure the holistic needs of residents are responded to through spiritual care.

They provide comfort, healing, or just a friendly face in times of change, illness, loss or grief. These staff members are part of Catholic Healthcare's Pastoral Care team, an integral component of our Enrich Model of Care. Safe, friendly, inclusive and free from judgement, Pastoral Care practitioners and volunteers reach out to those in need, providing spiritual and emotional support to residents, Home Care clients, and their families.

Tom Davies, Pastoral Care Coordinator based at Coolamon Villa in Mullumbimby, is one of a 30-strong team of Pastoral Carer practitioners who work across Catholic Healthcare.

"My role is to provide spiritual support to our residents and their families, in which ever way that spirituality is expressed by them," says Tom. "Spirituality can be religious, or it could be family, music, a love of sport or nature. I ensure residents connect with their unique spiritual, emotional and wellbeing needs which means the most to them.

"We offer guidance and spiritual companionship to anyone who needs it regardless of background, faith or belief system. We can sit with residents and listen, take in what they have to say, and bring empathy and understanding, helping them find meaning and purpose in a situation."

Originally from Wales, Tom moved to Australia as a young man, met a local Mullumbimby girl while studying in Queensland and moved to regional Northern NSW a few years ago. Tom and his wife live close to Coolamon Villa with their two year-old son with another baby on the way.

"I studied literature and then completed a Graduate Diploma in Psychology," continues Tom. "I wanted to obtain some practical experience in counselling so applied for the Pastoral Care role at Coolamon. I am enjoying it so much, getting to know all the residents.

"I am particularly inspired by the book, *The Wounded Healer* by Henri J M Nouwen, and the message that as



Pastoral Carers we are not counsellors. We are not here to 'fix' things, we enter a journey with residents and their families – we travel with them.


"For a person in the last stage of their journey, I provide comfort and companionship. Being there when someone is dying is one of the greatest privileges of my life. Yesterday a man started to decline very rapidly. I sat with him and made him comfortable in line with his wishes. Something happens during that witnessing – you see a small reflection of the divine."

Catholic Healthcare's Mission theme for 2021, Reaching Out, resonates with Tom.

"Our Mission is to promote life in all its fullness and we do this by 'reaching out' to our residents, their families and our colleagues. We work together every day to build bridges and create connection."


